Why music?

- Listening to music has been shown to relieve depression and increase self-esteem in older people
- Playing an instrument or singing in a choir can enhance emotional well-being, brain health, cognition and hearing functions.
- Listening to music 'lights up' some parts of the brain, however, playing music lights up practically every part of the brain.
- The structured format of playing music improves the ability of the brain to carry out other activities, such as fine motor skills, linguistics, mathematical precision.
- There is often an emotional aspect to music
- It's fun!







How it was set up

Initial public meeting to gauge interest (11 men and one woman turned up)

Find a venue:

- Accessible
- Musician friendly
- Social feel
- 'private' (not disturb other customers)
- Is there opportunity for further socialising before / after the group
- What to charge?







What we have?

- Use of whole venue (normally closed at this time)
- Bar is open!
- £2 fee each week includes a free cup of coffee or tea (& biscuits if there is fair winds and following seas)
- The fee goes direct to the owner / manager
- 2 hours per week, Wednesday evenings 6-8pm.
- Our session precedes the venue's weekly 'Open Mic Night'. We aim to perform here (for those who want to) on the last Wednesday of the month.







What you may need?

- Exclusive space, preferably with access to a bar area
- Somewhere where furniture can be moved about to suit your needs
- Opportunity to socialise bar or café area close by
- Self funding weekly fee with agreement of venue manager
- Set up for evenings (feels more natural)
- Someone to take the lead
- Ability to print out sheets. Putting music on-line is also advantageous.







How are we doing?

- Self-funding from day one
- Usually between 10 and 13 men at each session (any bigger and it will become unmanageable)
- We have been running around 11 months and new members joining all the time
- Performed in public at Open Mic Night several times
- Always getting positive feedback from members
- Every week is enjoyable

Although it's not for everyone.




















What do the men say?
